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

### **PAS Profile Interpretation**

The Pain Acceptance Scale (PAS) measures three factors of pain acceptance:

Coping Strength (CS) quantifies the patient's efficacy beliefs for moving forward with the challenges of life despite pain.

Reconciliation (R) assesses the patient's acceptance of the permanence and inevitability of pain.

Pain Tolerance (PT) evaluates the patient's beliefs of pain tolerance.

The Total PAS score (Total PAS) is the mean value of the three PAS scales. Higher scale scores (>3) and Total PAS scores (>3) indicates a greater amount of pain acceptance. Pain acceptance is associated with a patient's mood, other pain beliefs, psychological distress, activity level, and overall adjustment.

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## **CONCLUSIONS**

The patient was administered the PAS to evaluate his/her pain acceptance. Below is a summary of the results.
